## Winterbourne Certificate in Garden Design

Costs: £950

Lessons: 30 lessons on Wednesdays from end September 2022. Lessons will run from 10am-2.45pm (includes 45 min

lunch). There will also be 3 drawing weeks scheduled.

#### Course aim

To develop the skills necessary to design gardens and understand how to create them.

### **Entry requirements**

Learners will need to have a Level 2 horticultural qualification or relevant experience in the Horticulture industry. This course although not accredited by an awarding body is broadly equivalent to a study at Level 3.

### **Course content**

During the course learners will create a portfolio of drawings and designs for a range of gardens. This can include a show garden or show border. The tutors can give support if learners would like to apply for a show such as Gardeners World Live using their course work.

The learning programme will include:

- 1. Formal lecture sessions
- 2. Practical sessions
- 3. Written assignments
- 4. Practical assessments/ assignments.

To create these drawings and plans learners will need to purchase or have access to drawing equipment. A list will be distributed to learners before the start of the courses.
